Preface

The Baltic Youth Waves for Democracy 2025 stands as a collective call to action from the young generation of the Baltic Sea Region—voices united by a shared vision of democracy, participation, and innovation in a rapidly changing world.

Held from 26–30 October 2025 in Gdańsk and Sopot, Poland, alongside the EUSBSR Annual Forum and the BSSSC Annual Conference, this initiative brought together youth delegates, policymakers, and experts from across the region to explore how digital transformation can strengthen democratic resilience and regional cooperation.

This position paper is the outcome of months of dialogue, collaboration, and learning—beginning with preparatory webinars and culminating in an intensive on-site co-creation process. It builds upon the foundations laid by the CBSS Youth Ministerial 2025 on Digitalisation, draws inspiration from the [#b_hack] Hackathon 2025 in Lübeck, and contributes to the priorities of the CBSS, the EUSBSR and the BSSSC.

Environmental Sustainability

Heat islands
